CREAMED CORN CASSEROLE (Easier Eats) If you like corn, and really, who doesn't, then you will enjoy this casserole. Not only is it easy and inexpensive, but Secretary Sandra can vouch that it tastes great too. It's an excellent side dish for your Christmas ham.

Ingredients:

1/2 cup unsalted butter; 1/4 cup all-purpose flour; 1/4 cup granulated sugar; 2 eggs, well beaten; 1 cup whole milk; 1 (15.25-ounce) can whole kernel sweet corn, drained; 1 (14.75-ounce) can creamed-style sweet corn; 1/2 tsp. salt; 1/2 tsp. ground black pepper

Preheat oven to 350°. In saucepan, heat the butter slowly over medium-low heat, swirling the pan until it's just melted. Let the butter cool for 2-3 minutes. Whisk the flour into the melted butter until well incorporated. Whisk in the sugar, the eggs and the milk. Stir the whole kernel corn and the creamed corn into the butter mixture. Season with the salt and pepper. Pour the corn mixture into a shallow 8x8-inch baking dish. Bake uncovered until the center is set and the casserole is browned and caramelized on top, about 1 hour 15 minutes. Let stand for 5 minutes.
